## Dear Friends

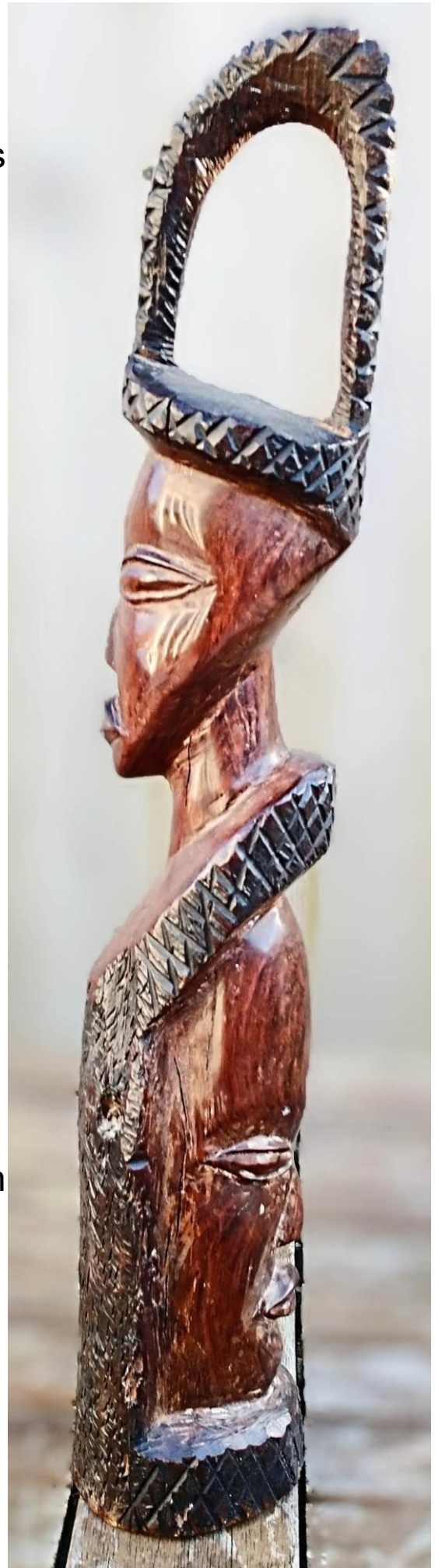
